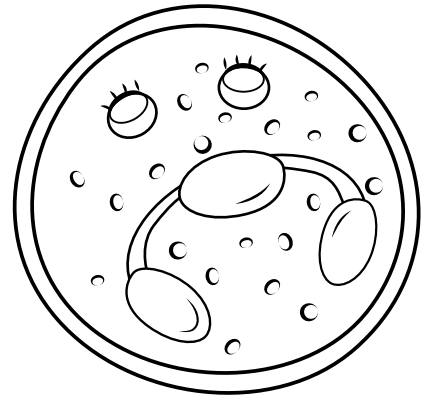

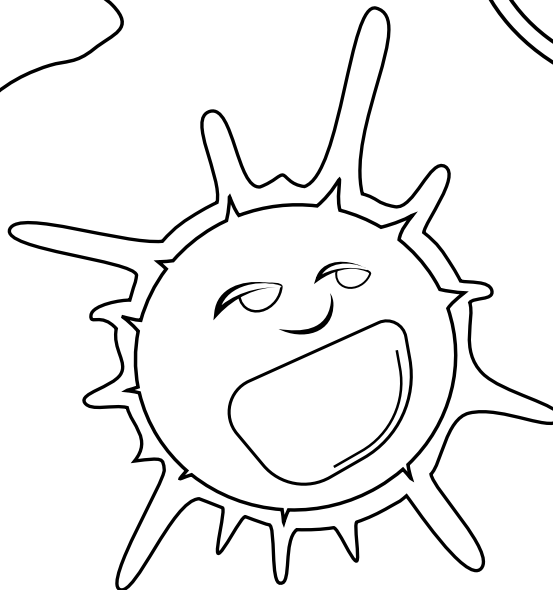


Lymphocyte

DID YOU KNOW?

The immune system contains many kinds of cells that protect us from invaders, like bacteria, that might make us sick. These cells each have different jobs. For example, neutrophils release signals that tell other immune cells that bacteria have been spotted. These signals attract cells like macrophages to the site of invasion where they “eat” and kill the bacteria.
